**Day 1 Hanoi**

Today you can check into your hotel and spend the day exploring the streets of Hanoi. Look for the Wide Eyed Tours welcome note at reception, on it your leader will have arranged a time to meet with you to run through the tour itinerary. After the group meeting, walk around the lake to sample some of Hanoi's best at a well known Vietnamese restaurant.

**Day 2 Halong Bay**

After breakfast it's off to Ha Long Bay for the day (group tour for small group numbers). On the boat you will eat an array of fresh sea food whilst cruising through some of the thousands of limestone karsts within this World Heritage site. There is an opportunity to swim in the bay's emerald waters, explore caves with incredible formations of stalactites and stalagmites and enjoy the tranquility of this bay of wonders. Later, it's back to the harbor for your return journey back to Hanoi. Settle in time then off to dinner.

### Day 3 Hanoi

This morning involves a city tour followed by free time. In the evening attend a performance of traditional water puppetry followed by dinner & a night cyclo ride back to the hotel.

### Day 4 Hue

This morning is an early flight to Hue. After transferring to the hotel, brief settle in time then onto lunch trying local dishes such as Banh Khoai. After lunch you get to visit the Imperial Citadel, followed by free time

### Day 5 Hue

The former Imperial Capital of Vietnam, you are sure to enjoy the many sights and slower pace of this tranquil city. Today you will visit two of the Nguyen Emperors' tombs, the famed Thien Mu Pagoda. Hue, known as the centre of Buddhism and education in Vietnam, has a wealth of pagodas and monasteries to discover. You may wish to check out the bustling Dong Ba Market which offers a vast array of goods and foods to see and sample, including some traditional Hue specialties.

### Day 6 Hoi An

You will leave Hue and head south through coastal rice paddies to the fishing village of Lang Co, before taking the scenic mountainous route over the spectacular Hai Van Pass. In the afternoon, you will arrive at the once bustling river port of Hoi An (approx. 4 hours driving time). Declared a World Heritage site, the architecture of Hoi An is being beautifully restored and preserved. It's also a shopping mecca, with much to browse over and buy. Choose from original paintings, handcrafted woodwork, ceramics, embroidery, lanterns and more. Hoi An has also become famous for its tailoring - there is a huge variety of fabrics to choose from.

### Day 7 Hoi An

Free day for you to make the most of what Hoi An has to offer. Enjoy the local sea food and relax on the beaches.

### Day 8 Hoi An

Today is a look into how food is prepared and made with a cooking demo (included) that includes a visit to the local market. The afternoon is free for you to have that last minute outfit made up!

### Day 9 Ho Chi Minh City

A short flight of just over one hour takes you from Da Nang to Ho Chi Minh City. After transferring to the hotel, there is time to settle in, followed by a walking tour to some of Saigon's shopping spots. If shopping isn't your thing then maybe a relaxing drink at a roof top bar.

### Day 10 Ho Chi Minh City

This morning is an early start to first go and visit the former Viet Cong stronghold at Cu Chi where the tunnel system provides a valuable insight into the tenacity and resourcefulness of the Vietnamese people. Back to HCM city, lunch followed by an orientation tour by cyclo of the main attractions, including the very sobering War Remnants Museum. Your hotel is centrally located to the city's main shopping district and Ben Thanh Market, so there is much for you to explore and discover during the afternoon.

#### Accommodation:

3 star hotels (13 nights). Breakfast is included in all hotels where you have stayed the previous night.

#### Included Activities

Halong Bay boat trip includes meals & entrance fee; Imperial Citadel, Tomb x 1 in Hue; orientation tour Hoi An, HCMC, Cu Chi Tunnels, cyclo tour, War Remnants museum, day tour to Mekong Delta, including boat tour. All airport transfers in Cambodia, tourist visa (Cambodia only) private tour of the Angkor Complex including guide, transport, and entrance fees.

All transport and meals included. All flights during the tour are included. Bring along USD200 for optional activities not included in the trip.

#### Tipping Guide

For your leader we recommend \$2 USD a day. For drivers & local guides, we recommend \$1 USD a day.

#### Wide Eyed Tours Rules

**Day 11 Ho Chi Minh City**

Today it's off to the fascinating Mekong where you get to see how life is dependant on the river for survival. Taking a boat cruise on the mighty Mekong allows for numerous photo opportunities. Another highlight is you will also get to sample an array of tropical fruits that are grown locally. Back on the bus for the return journey back to HCM City and if time allows, some more shopping before dinner.

**Day 12 Siem Reap**

After one & a half hours flight time you will arrive into Siem Reap. Visas are processed at the airport before transferring to your hotel in Siem Reap. Your local Cambodian guide will meet you to discuss the itinerary for seeing the Angkor complex. If time permits take in the sunset from one of these historical sites, which includes Angkor Wat, Angkor Thom, and the Bayon temples.

**Day 13 Siem Reap**

Rise early to watch the sunrise over one of mankind's greatest achievements and continue your exploration of the temple complex. This afternoon take a boat ride on Tonle Sap Lake. In the evening you will feast on a buffet while taking in a cultural dance show.

**Day 14 Siem Reap**

In the morning, transfer to the airport for your onward journey.

***Angkor Wat***

The temples of Angkor, built by the Khmer civilization between 802 and 1220 AD, represent one of humankind's most astonishing and enduring architectural achievements. From Angkor, the Khmer kings ruled over a vast domain that reached from Vietnam to China to the Bay of Bengal. The structures one sees at Angkor today, more than 100 stone temples in all, are the surviving remains of a grand religious, social and administrative metropolis whose other buildings – palaces, public buildings, and houses – were built of wood and are long since decayed and gone.
